I hope you’ll read on and be inspired by this month’s newsletter and how Christ is alive and active at Gethsemane today!

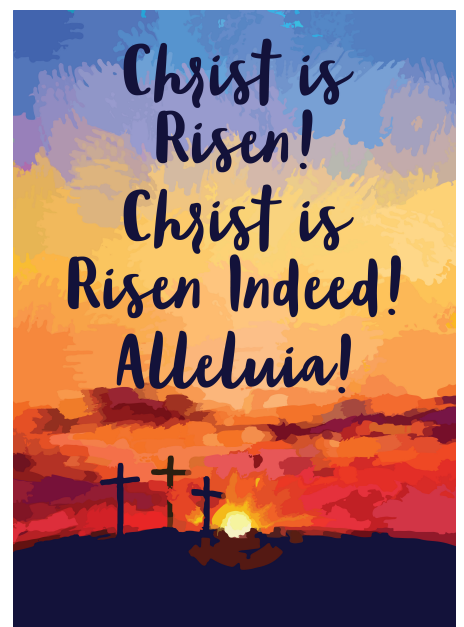

Adult Ed Series Using ELCA's "A Study Curriculum on Civic Life and Faith"

Christian Nationalism is "a cultural framework that idealizes and advocates fusion of certain Christian views with American civic life. This political ideology, whether explicit or not, includes the beliefs that the US. Constitution was divinely inspired and enjoys godly status, that Christianity should be a privileged religion in the U.S., that the nation holds a special status in God's eyes and that good Americans must hold Christian beliefs."

Have you encountered the description of the United States as a "Christian nation"? If so, what was your reaction? How do you see a difference between Christian nationalism and exercising citizenship as a Christian?

Such questions are timely and important for all of us at Gethsemane, especially now as we all negotiate the current election year. During April and May, during the Adult Ed hour after worship each Sunday, we will work through a several-session series developed by ELCA called "A Study Curriculum on Civic Life and Faith." These sessions will be held in the sanctuary starting April 7th.

Holy Hilarity – Sunday, April 7, 9:30 am

Many American churches are resurrecting an old Easter custom begun by the early Greek Christians --- "Bright Sunday" or "Holy Humor Sunday" celebrations on the Sunday after Easter. For centuries in all Christian faith traditions, the week following Easter Sunday was observed by the faithful as "days of joy and laughter" with parties and picnics to celebrate Jesus' resurrection. Here at Gethsemane, we call it "Holy Hilarity Sunday" and we celebrate by ringing a bell or other noise maker every time we hear Hallelujah said or sung in worship. This will all take place on Sunday, April 7, at 9:30 am.

February 19th, 2024

Approval of Prior Month's Minutes

Bill presented the minutes from last month's meeting for approval and **moved** to approve last month's minutes. Seconded by Joel. Motion **passed** unanimously.

Officers' Reports

Pastor

Pastor TJ Reported that Diane completed and submitted the synod congregation report for 2023. Confirmation camp was last weekend and it went great. Ben and Pastor TJ are exploring different models of confirmation class. We received word that the Pastor called to the IYK congregation has been accepted for an R-1 Visa; we hope to have a joint celebration soon. Pastor has been meeting with Mission and Ministry and is excited about the directions of the conversations. Pastor has been working with Play and Learn and the Play and Learn Committee.

President

No President's report.

Vice President

Treasurer

February financials have been posted. February contributions information is deceptive due to the annuity from John Jacob which makes it look like our contributions were \$57,000. Sale of the annuity resulted in a third party contribution of \$32,886. Absent the annuity proceeds, contributions for the month were unfavorable to the budget by approximately \$5000. On a positive note, income exceeded expenses by approximately \$3200.

Play and Learn Financial review - A firm has been identified to carry out a financial review of Play and Learn as required by the church constitution. A

license visit was done at Play and Learn and it was learned that Brenda was listed as the owner; needs to be addressed; the committee feels it should be listed as a member of GLC council.

Continuing Business

Strategic Plan Implementation

- Communications Website Update - Joel, Pastor and Bill met with Paul about the GLC website and are feeling very positive about going forward in the process to update the website. It will be kept "in house". A test site will be ready sometime in July with an August launch.
- Daubert consulting agreement - Pastor TJ has followed up with Dave Daubert and is working towards an agreement.
- Other progress - Bill has received and shared many reports requested from the ministry teams. The council members are encouraged to review them.

Infant House Remodel update

The Ad hoc team met Monday afternoon; R.R. Isler is holding a July start date for construction. The plans have been submitted to the city for permit. Modulares are needed to house the infant care during construction and the total expected cost for modulares is \$125,000 for a year. Permits for modulares are handled by the modular rental company. Tentatively, a special Congregational meeting is planned for April 21st (*since the council meeting the date has been set for April 28th*) to seek approval from the congregation to go forward with the project.

New Business

2025 Fiscal Year Budget

- Roland distributed the draft budget forms to the various people assigned by ministry teams. He has received lots of good questions about the draft which is a good sign for engagement in the process. It is expected cost will increase, a rough estimate of \$18,000 more than last year is suggested.
- Council discussed expectations and goals for 2025 fiscal year budget planning. Council members will strive for a balanced budget. The council reserves the ability to approve or deny budgets requests for Ministry teams.

Welcome Immigrants Sign

Bill Darlage sent a brief history of the sign welcoming immigrants hanging on the side of the GLC building. Council was asked to consider this history and explore what we are doing to actively help this cause.

Southern Ohio Synod - Representatives are needed to attend the Synod Assembly in Beaver Creek, Ohio (one day event) in June.
